EXECUTIVE RISK DASHBOARD

CATEGORY	STATUS	EXECUTIVE IMPACT
Overall Executive Travel Risk	MODERATE-ELEVATED	Triathlon closures, multiple large events, a major Ukraine solidarity march and persistent urban crime exposure are the principal movement concerns.
Demonstration / Public Order	ELEVATED	Verified Ukraine Independence Day Unity March stages at Chicago/Ashland 11 a.m.-1 p.m.; march 1-3 p.m. toward Saints Volodymyr & Olha.
Weather	LOW-MODERATE	Mostly sunny and comfortable; NWS Beach Hazards Statement for Cook County beaches with dangerous currents and 3-5 ft waves.
Ground Transportation	ELEVATED	Extensive Chicago Triathlon closures affect DuSable Lake Shore Drive, Lower Wacker, Columbus and Balbo into midday/afternoon.
Air Travel	LOW-MODERATE	No major weather disruption indicated; live airport pages show manageable conditions, but flight-specific status must be reconfirmed.
Protective Intelligence	LOW-MODERATE	No verified executive-specific threat identified. Heightened situational awareness warranted near high-density event and protest corridors.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Chicago executive travel risk is assessed as **MODERATE-ELEVATED** for Sunday. The dominant operational issue is the Chicago Triathlon, with major morning closures on DuSable Lake Shore Drive, Lower Wacker Drive, Columbus Drive and Balbo Drive. Additional crowd and traffic pressure will come from Bulls Fest at the United Center, West Loop Art Fest, the India Independence Day Parade on Devon Avenue, White Sox-Mets at Rate Field and Lakeview Taco Fest. A verified Ukraine Independence Day Unity March will stage in Ukrainian Village from 11:00 a.m. with a 1:00 p.m. march start and 3:00 p.m. conclusion. Weather is favorable for executive movement, though a Beach Hazards Statement is in effect for Cook County beaches. No credible executive-specific threat was identified in reviewed reporting.

WEATHER & OPERATIONAL IMPLICATIONS

Current: Mostly sunny, about 72°F at publication time. **Today:** Mostly sunny and pleasant, high near 76°F; low near 63°F. **Lakefront:** NWS Beach Hazards Statement is in effect from 9:00 a.m. through this evening for northern and central Cook County, with high wave action, dangerous currents and waves around 3-5 feet. **Protective posture:** Weather should not materially degrade roadway movement, but lakefront teams should keep principals away from exposed shoreline structures and account for gusty lake conditions near event zones.

AIR TRAVEL & AIRPORT ACCESS

O'Hare (ORD): FlyChicago live reporting indicates generally manageable operations; recent official pages show arrivals within 15 minutes and variable departure delay conditions. **Midway (MDW):** Recent official pages show arrivals and departures generally within 15 minutes and open parking capacity. **Assessment:** Air travel risk remains LOW-MODERATE. Confirm the individual flight, carrier, terminal curb/FBO and surface route immediately before movement; weekend event traffic is a larger near-term driver than weather.

Lakefront / Downtown	Triathlon closures affect southbound DuSable Lake Shore Drive, Lower Wacker, Columbus, Balbo and the Randolph lakefront approaches. Expect major morning detours and spillover congestion.
West Loop / United Center	Bulls Fest 7 a.m.-5 p.m. at United Center and West Loop Art Fest 10 a.m.-7 p.m. add pedestrian, rideshare and curbside pressure across Madison/Damen and Fulton Market.
Ukrainian Village	Unity March staging 11 a.m.-1 p.m. at Chicago/Ashland; march 1-3 p.m. toward 739 N. Oakley. Expect temporary traffic control on Chicago Avenue and adjacent side streets.
South Side / Rate Field	White Sox host the Mets at 1:10 p.m. Expect congestion on 35th, Wentworth, Shields and Dan Ryan approaches before and after the game.
Devon Avenue	India Independence Day Parade begins 10:30 a.m. on Devon from Western toward California, creating localized closures and pedestrian density.

Organizers describe it as a large public demonstration of support for Ukraine. Expect police traffic control, dense pedestrian movement and intermittent closures.
No other major Loop protest verified	Loop / Federal Plaza / Daley Plaza	No additional large Aug. 23 Loop demonstration was verified in the reviewed public calendars. This does not exclude short-notice activity; recheck Federal Plaza, Daley Plaza/City Hall and Michigan Avenue before principal movements.
ONGOING STRIKE - VERIFIED	Cook County / Forest Preserves	Nearly 200 Forest Preserve District workers represented by Teamsters Local 700 remain on strike following the Aug. 17 walkout. Preserves remain open. Picketing may occur at preserve worksites or government-related locations.
UNCONFIRMED SOCIAL MEDIA	City Hall / government sites	Prior social-media claims of specific downtown picketing locations have not been independently verified for today. Treat any such posts as unconfirmed until corroborated by direct observation, official notice or reliable reporting.

Bulls Fest	7:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. / United Center	Heavy pedestrian traffic and rideshare demand near Madison, Damen, Warren and I-290 approaches.
West Loop Art Fest	10:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m. / Fulton Market	Fulton Street closure from Aberdeen to Peoria; expect neighborhood congestion and limited curb access.
India Independence Day Parade	10:30 a.m. / Devon Ave.	Parade activity from Western toward California; localized closures and dense pedestrian activity.
Mets @ White Sox	1:10 p.m. / Rate Field	Game-day congestion on Dan Ryan exits and 35th/Wentworth/Shields approaches; expect post-game egress surge.

PUBLIC SAFETY & CRIME DEVELOPMENTS

Armed phone robberies - Bronzeville/Lake Meadows: Chicago police issued a community alert after three recent armed robberies in which victims were approached at night, threatened with guns and ordered to unlock and surrender their mobile phones. Reported locations include the 400 block of E. 32nd Street and the 3000 block of S. State Street. This is directly relevant to Near South Side movements, 31st Street/King Drive corridors and transfers between downtown, McCormick Place/Wintrust Arena and South Side destinations.

Protective interpretation: Minimize exposed pedestrian time, keep principals off phones during curbside transitions, avoid predictable stationary pickup points, and stage vehicles before principals exit controlled locations. Routine citywide violent-crime and vehicle-theft exposure remains a standing concern, especially during high-footfall weekend periods.



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PROTECTIVE INTELLIGENCE STAFF ASSESSMENT

ASSESSMENT

Executive travel risk is **MODERATE-ELEVATED** through today. The principal threat to schedule integrity is not a targeted security threat, but overlapping mobility and crowd conditions: the Chicago Triathlon closes major lakefront and Lower Wacker corridors, while Bulls Fest, West Loop Art Fest, the India Independence Day Parade, White Sox-Mets and neighborhood festivals generate secondary congestion. The verified Ukraine Independence Day Unity March adds a significant public-order footprint in Ukrainian Village from late morning through mid-afternoon. The Cook County Forest Preserves strike remains an active labor issue. No reviewed source identified a credible threat specifically directed at executives, corporate facilities or protective teams.

1	Reconfirm every downtown and lakefront route immediately before movement. Treat Lower Wacker and southbound Lake Shore Drive as unreliable until triathlon closures clear.
2	Preserve alternate pickup points. Use west-side or interior Loop staging locations when lakefront/Columbus access is restricted, and brief drivers before principals move.
3	Avoid Ukrainian Village march corridors from late morning through mid-afternoon unless the movement is mission-essential. Monitor Chicago/Ashland, Chicago Avenue and Oakley-area access.
4	Minimize stationary exposure at all event venues. Keep principals inside controlled spaces until vehicles are staged, doors are clear and the route is confirmed.
5	Apply heightened phone-theft countermeasures on Near South Side pedestrian approaches. Keep devices out of view and reduce exposed foot movement near 31st/32nd and State/King corridors.
6	Reconfirm ORD/MDW flight status and terminal curb conditions immediately before departure. Weather is favorable, but airport operating conditions and weekend demand can change rapidly.

24-72 HOUR OUTLOOK

Monday, August 24: Event-driven mobility risk trends lower after the triathlon and weekend festivals. Continue to monitor any residual Ukraine Independence Day activity and the ongoing Forest Preserves labor dispute. **Tuesday, August 25:** Generally favorable weather and more normal commuter patterns; routine downtown construction, crime exposure and airport-transfer variability remain. **Wednesday, August 26:** Thunderstorm potential returns and may increase roadway and airport disruption risk; reassess weather, flood-prone routes and flight operations before executive movements.

This brief is based on publicly available information reviewed near publication time. Real-time traffic, protest, police, weather and aviation conditions can change without notice. Social-media reporting is used only where specifically identified and should be independently verified before operational use.
